Odyssey Program Evaluation

SMART objectives are statements that clearly define success for Odyssey. The acronym SMART was used to develop objectives that are Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, and Time-Bound. 2011 marked the 4th year of data gathered on our students' summer achievement.

A Quest for Knowledge...

75% of Odyssey Elementary students improved by at least half a grade level in reading.

83% of Odyssey Elementary students demonstrated math gains.

91% of Odyssey Elementary and 93% of Odyssey Middle School students read a minimum of two books.

75% of Odyssey Elementary and 91% of Odyssey Middle School students demonstrated writing improvement.

98% of Odyssey Middle School students met mathematics expectations.

68% of Odyssey High students demonstrated writing improvement.

... A Path to College

97% of Odyssey 2011 students missed 3 days or less during the six week Odyssey program.

74% of Odyssey 2011 students had participated in Odyssey previously.

90% of Odyssey's first cohort (high school graduates in 2011) are currently enrolled in college.
